She has published more than 80 scholarly articles, surveys and book chapters on topics including algorithmic game theory, market design, social networks, theoretical computer science and economics. Her honors include being recognized with the Harvard Excellence in Teaching Award (2018), a Sloan Fellowship (2012) and an NSF Career Award (2010). Immorlica is the incoming Chair of SIGecom, ACM's Special Interest Group on Economics and Computation, Vice Chair of SIGACT, ACM's Special Interest Group on Algorithms and Computation Theory, and an Associate Editor of ACM Transactions on Economics and Computing (TEAC). She is also the Program Co-chair for the 20th ACM Conference on Economics and Computation.
